YOUR BEST STOPS

Downtown Titusville & Welcome Center– Historic Downtown Titusville is an excellent place to spend some time before and after a rocket launch. Visit the American Space Museum for history of space and interactive fun. Discover places to grab a bite, a mural trail and lots of history.

Kennedy Space Center Visitor Complex

- Surrounded by actual rockets from years past, the Visitor Complex offers both a look back at space history and insights on current and future exploration. Scobie Park – Near the intersection off Main Street and Indian River Avenue, Scobie Park may not be huge, but it is mighty. A favorite spot for locals to catch a launch at the edge of the Lagoon, you can also enjoy permanent map displays and take your turn at the free binocular device. 28.62452464326403, -80.80472345609162

Max Brewer Bridge – There are spectacular views from the top of Max Brewer Bridge, and directly on the riverfront next to the Bridge is Sand Point Park, with playgrounds, picnic tables and a splash pad. You cannot go wrong. In addition, this park allows dogs on a leash. Sand Point Park is located at the base of Max Brewer Bridge which will allow you parking to climb up the Max Brewer Bridge for an even better vantage point. 101 N Washington Ave. 32796; 28.6172412, -80.80736960000002

Parrish Park – On both sides of SR-402 east of the Max Brewer Bridge, you will find Parrish Park with convenient access to the Indian River for fishing, water sports, sunbathing and launch viewing. It's also a great place to launch a kayak or a boat and view a launch from the water. Recreational amenities include picnic shelters, restrooms, boardwalk, fishing pier and boat ramps. A. Lookouts on the Refuge – The road to reach the beach is SR-402 passes through Merritt Island National Wildlife Rrefuge, and there are several viewing stops along the way where you look out over the water. If the time is right you may catch a spectacular glimpse of a spacecraft on a Launch Pad. (Always check for restrictions, may be closed for some launches. fws.gov/refuge/merritt-island)

Playalinda Beach – Part of Canaveral National Seashore, Playalinda Beach is one of the most beautiful beaches in the U.S., and also boasts some of the best waves on Florida's Space Coast. Normally peaceful, expect crowds. It is a spectacular spot for launch viewing with its close proximity to launch pads. There is a fee to enter Plavalinda Beach but is free with a national park pass! (Always check for restrictions, may be closed for some launches: NPS.gov/cana) East end of SR 402 – Plavalinda Beach Entrance Station: 28.6450, -80.6834

VIEWS FROM OUR PARKS

Chain of Lakes Park – Although your launch view from the ground is obstructed by vegetation here, this park makes our lists because of the Observation Tower, which offers sweeping views of the lagoon and a bird's-eve view for launch. The Observation Tower is only accessible from the trails, so walking (or bicycling will be involved), but the travel distance is worth it. The park has two playgrounds, walking trails, and plenty of parking, as well as restroom facilities. 2300 Truman Scarborough Way, 32796; 28.6413487, -80.82679150000001

William J Manzo Memorial Park – Facilities include a playground near restrooms and picnic facilities. This park also features a paved walkway. grills, a pavilion and riverfront boardwalk. 3335 S Washington Ave. 32780: 28.5784002. -80.7989207

Rotary Riverfront Park – Rotary Park boasts amazing river and launch views located right next to a McDonald's with indoor play area. There are pavilions, a playground and restrooms that make it a perfect family gathering place for a launch. 4141 S Washington Ave. 32780: 28.5664941. -80.7978286
