

### **Head North**

Take U.S.1 to New Smyrna Beach. The city has lovely beaches that offer a different kind of adventure, even allowing

vehicles to drive on the beach in some areas. *Here are a couple of favorites:* 

- a New Smyrna City Beach (Enter at 3rd Avenue)
- **(b) Flagler Avenue Beach** (a little north of 3rd Avenue)
- © 27th Ave Beachfront Park
- d Canaveral National Seashore Visitor Information Center

Travel seven miles south of New Smyrna Beach on A1A and you can continue to learn more at the Canaveral National Seashore Visitor Information Center (d). Apollo Beach: Wheelchair-accessible ramps at Stops 1-5. (Parking Lot 5 open only on weekends.).

**Klondike Beach:** The road ends at Apollo, but you can walk or bike to Klondike Beach, if you really want to get away from it all.

## **Discover Beautiful Playalinda**



**Begin Here.** Head east over Max Brewer Bridge and into the Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge (MINWR). There are beautiful stops along the way, and you may even see a rocket on a launch pad. At Canaveral National Seashore, you'll find 24 miles of federally protected lands, a view for miles of water, sand and sky, still very much what indigenous people saw so long ago. (There is a small day or multi-day fee per vehicle

or you can purchase an annual pass.)

#### On our Playalinda Beach Adventure Stops 1-10 are Open.

Wheelchair-accessible ramps are at Stops 2,3, 8 & 10 (noted\* on the map).

#### **Head South to Port Canaveral**

(a) Jetty Park Beach: From working fishing boats and special tours to plenty of seaside restaurants, Port Canaveral is the perfect stop. Before or after playing in the sand at Jetty Park Beach, visit The Cove Dining District and wave at the cruise ships as they head to sea.

**b** Cherie Down Park, Cape Canaveral, is a lovely



# beach stop just a bit south of the Port. World-Famous Cocoa Beach

© Westgate Cocoa Beach Pier, is a famous spot, with dining, fishing and shopping on the long pier.

- **d Shepard Park** (named after Astronaut Alan Shepard) is a great stop with the bonus of being right next door to Ron Jon Surf Shop, beach rentals of many kinds, and the Florida Surf Museum.
- **(e)** Lori Wilson Park has some natural trail areas, plenty of places to picnic and you might catch a beach volleyball game there.
- **f** Cocoa Main Street is at the hub, with dining and shopping and places to catch a cold drink at the heart of town, with parking garage.
